After-School Program

Martin Housing Authority has been providing professional tutoring services to children in K-8th grade at our Community Center since 1999. We have a certified teacher on staff, as well as, additional tutors and volunteers who assist our students in maximizing their academic potential. The program focuses on assisting and developing students reading and math skills.

Our Community Center is the home to an up to date computer lab where students have supervised access to state of the art computer technology, educational software, and the World Wide Web.

In addition to the academic program, students are also given the opportunity to participate in structured activities and special educational programs that promote healthy development.



Summer Program

During the summer months, our students are exposed to an array of activities that are designed to entertain, educate and, in general, enhance the daily lives of our students. These services are provided either at minimal or no charge to the participants. Such activities may include: participation in the Summer Reading Program at the public library, local and out-of-town field trips, health education and personal safety programs, team building activities, indoor and outdoor games, swimming, community service projects, free dental services, arts & crafts, and participation in day camps.

In addition to structured activities, Martin Housing Authority partners with the Dept. of Human Services to sponsor the Free Summer Lunch Program for all children ages 18 and under. Lunch is served
